But then you tell us – again – this story, of a compassionate person, who refuses to pass by a fellow human being in distress, even though that person would never have called him 'neighbor.' This despised Samaritan refused to 'other' the person in need, and instead, cared for him, treating him like family.

Forgive us, we pray, for all the times we have heard you say, "Go and do likewise" and we have said, "No."

Have mercy on us, O Lord, as the Samaritan had mercy on that man. Amen.
