Breaking of the Bread

The word
“**thanksgiving**,” in its
Greek-derived form,
“Eucharist,” is the most

emphasizes the sense of

gather, or “Holy
Communion,” which
emphasizes our intimate
spiritual relationship with
Christ.

Day.
